Town Chapter Harley Owners Group ("OTC HOG") has been involved with the "PAWS for Patriots" for the past eighteen (18) years. This year, we will be hosting our fifth (5th) annual Paws for Patriots Sporting Clays Tournament to support veterans that have been blinded, have lost limbs and/or suffer from PTSD. These Veterans need our help. The Veteran's Administration does not recognize service animals as a prosthetic need and therefore will not pay for a guide dog or assistance dog to be assigned to a Disabled Veteran. However, through Southeastern Guide Dogs and with your private donations, we are able to help impaired Veterans to regain their freedom, mobility, independence and dignity thru three levels of service: 1) to provide a live-in guide dog to visually impaired Veterans, 2) to provide Assistance Dogs who provide comfort to Veterans with Post Traumatic Stress Syndrome, and 3) provide Facility Therapy Dogs, escorted by volunteer handlers, who visit wounded warriors recovering at Military Hospitals and Veterans Medical Centers.

It is Election Season for the Country, State and your HOG Chapter

This Fall, we will be electing a Director for 2025. If you are interested in leading the best HOG Chapter in the country, then you need to submit your name to either Dennis Adams, our current Director, or to Jason Whidden, the General Manager at our sponsoring Dealer – Tampa Bay Harley Davidson. Nominations will open at the September 6th Chapter Meeting and close at the October 11th Chapter Meeting. Election of a Director for 2025 will take place at the November 8th Chapter Meeting.

Drew's Views Hydroplaning

<u>Most</u> Florida drivers have experienced this; <u>any</u> Florida **riders** that have won't soon forget it. Check this out, think about it, slow down in the rain, and don't lose traction!

From James R. Davis, a recognized expert in the field of motorcycle Safety Dynamics.

Hydroplaning results when tires move so FAST across a wet road, they don't have enough time to channel the water away from the tire's center. The water lifts the tire and thus all traction is lost. [Crikey!!]

Of course, 'fast' is relative. Tread design & depth, the bike's weight, tire pressure, the water's depth and even consistency - muddy or clean - play a part in affecting at what speed the tire will hydroplane. We can assess any speed over 60 MPH is fast enough to support hydroplaning regardless of the other variables.

However, this is not to say that at 55 MPH or slower you are safe from hydroplaning.

In any event, there are two **absolutely essential** NO-NO's to remember should you have the unfortunate experience of hydroplaning:

- Do NOT apply your brakes.
- Do NOT try to steer in any direction but straight ahead.

• [Do NOT use cruise control on wet roads, whether on 2, 3, 4 or more wheels]

I think if you start to hydroplane, you are likely going to go down unless you keep the front wheel pointed straight ahead and your hydroplaning is of the briefest of durations.

Drew again. "Briefest of durations." If you are riding at 60 mph and lose traction due to hydroplaning, only two things can happen. 1. You regain traction and hopefully keep control of the motorcycle. 2. You don't regain traction. Then what happens? You aren't going to slide across the water indefinitely. How long is the "duration?"



"You didn't think a little rain was going to stop your father from riding, did you?"

One last bit not stated in the article. The last time I lost traction I was riding south on 301 and slowed to turn left on McIntosh. I downshifted too quickly and lost traction on the rear tire for a split second. I don't think I was actually hydroplaning but just lost traction on a wet road.

Regardless, not an experience I want to repeat.
Always slow down on wet roads and think about **not** hydroplaning.

Keep the routine, routine. Safety is no accident.
