So, you want to be Director - time to submit your name draws near

As discussed in the September newsletter, nominations for Director for 2025 opened up at the September 6th Chapter Meeting. Nominations will close at the October 11th Chapter Meeting. If you are interested in the position of Director and have not submitted your name to either Dennis Adams or Jason Whidden, the General Manager at our sponsoring Dealer – Tampa Bay Harley Davidson, you need to act now. Please review my last article in the September newsletter to see if you qualify for the position. Once nominations close, the nominees will need to visit with Jason Whidden for approval to be placed on the ballot. For those unfamiliar with how HOG Chapters work, the sponsoring Dealer has final and absolute say on how the OTC HOG Chapter operates. This includes who is Director and whether or not we have an election.

Assuming that all nominees meet with Jason's approval, election of a Director for 2025 will take place at the November 8th Chapter Meeting. If there is only 1 candidate after nominations are closed at the October 11th Chapter Meeting and with Jason's approval, we can hold the election at the October Chapter Meeting by suspending Section 5 - General Election Voting of the OTC Bylaws. By doing so, it gives the new Director for 2025 an early start on filling the other board positions for 2025.

Ladies of Harley is open to all women in the Chapter - - you do not need to be a rider to participate. You must however be an active full or associate member of HOG to be affiliated with Ladies of Harley. Although LOH is free of charge, membership is not automatic. If you would like to join, simply contact the national HOG office and request membership.

Drew's Views

The 13 Most Common Causes of Motorcycle Accidents: How to Avoid Them

Short and sweet item this month, but plenty of food for thought.

1. **Left-hand turn accidents:** Stay w/in the speed limit; Cover the controls & be prepared to stop at intersections.

2. **Unsafe lane changes:** Always signal before switching lanes; Never drive in the middle of two lanes; Check blind spots before switching; Change one lane at a time; Never speed up when changing lanes; Never change lanes at an intersection.

3. Speeding: Just don't Don. Speed-related motorcycle accidents often end with fatalities.

4. Dooring: Note if parked vehicles are occupied. Stay away from parked vehicles in general.

5. Head-on collisions: Stay in correct lane; Maintain safe speed; Be aware of the road situation.

6. Alcohol use or other DUI: In the U.S., alcoholimpaired drivers cause 29 fatal accidents per day; 1 every 50 minutes. Steer clear of drivers exhibiting suspicious behavior.

7. Lane splitting: See dooring. Just don't do it Don.

 8. Sudden stops by the vehicle you are following: Maintain reasonable speeds and safe distances.
Practice the life-saving skill "Quick Stop" when you head out.

9. **Inexperienced or novice motorcycle riders:** Must eliminate distractions, remain aware of other vehicles, and practice life-saving skills. Quick stop, swerve. Take the free Tampa PD SMART Course.



Tampa SMART - Safe Motorcycle and Rider Techniques | City of Tampa

10. **Dangerous road conditions:** Slow down on rough roads; Keep a safe distance from vehicles to your front; Stop instead of swerving if possible; Eliminate distractions.

11. **Hitting fixed objects:** Be aware of the road situation; Maintain a reasonable speed; Avoid distractions and keep both hands on the handlebar.



12.**Running off the road or into oncoming traffic in a curve:** Be at the correct speed and in the correct gear before entering curves. Use the outside-inside-outside method to flatten curves.

13.**Motorcycle defects:** The cause of < 5% of accidents & easiest to avoid. Follow the maintenance schedule.

Remember:

Be Brilliant at the Basics. Keep the Routine, Routine. Every Move Must Have a Purpose.

<u>RIDING ON THE INTERSTATE</u> – MOTORCYCLE SAFETY TIPS

Riding a motorcycle on the interstate can be an exhilarating experience, but it also comes with its own set of challenges. Here are some tips to keep in mind:

1. **Gear Up**: Always wear proper protective gear, including a helmet, gloves, jacket, pants, and boots, also have rain gear on board. Proper gear offers both protection and comfort to make a big difference on long rides. Invest in high-quality protective gear, including a DOT-approved helmet, gloves, jacket, pants, and boots. Full gear can significantly reduce your chances of an accident.

2. Pre-Ride Inspection: Make sure your motorcycle is in good condition. Conduct a thorough pre-ride inspection of your motorcycle. Check the tires for proper tread and air pressure, oil levels, brake functionality, your battery and lights to ensure everything is in proper working order for the safest ride ahead.

3. Stay Visible: Wear bright or reflective clothing. This is true both during the day and at night time. Consider using a high-visibility vest. Whether riding solo or in a group ride, the bright vest increases your safety.

4. Use Signals Early: Signal your intentions well in advance of any lane changes or turns. Motorcycles can be less visible to drivers, so clear signaling helps communicate your movements. Consider using your signal in combination with hand signals, as both get other drivers' attention and make you a safer rider.

5. Keep a Safe Distance: Maintain a safe following distance from vehicles ahead of you. This gives you more time to react if something unexpected happens. Maintaining a safe following distance ahead gives you enough time to react to sudden stops or emergencies. Keeping a safe distance always applies; and especially more so during inclement weather such as foggy, rainy or other difficult traffic conditions.

6. Stay Focused & Take Rest Breaks: Keep your attention on the road and be aware of your surroundings. Avoid distractions like mobile phones or adjusting your music while riding. Remember the importance of "rest stops" to re-fuel, re-hydrate, and re-charge. This helps prevent fatigue and keeps you alert during your ride.

7. Watch for Road Hazards & Constructions Zones: Interstate roads can have debris, potholes, and other hazards. Keep an eye out for these and try to avoid them when possible. With construction zones, there might not always be a shoulder, as sometimes construction barriers leave no shoulder at all, which can be especially problematic if you have fuel, mechanical or weather issues, making it difficult to pull over.

8. **Maintain Speed and Control**: Ride at a speed that is comfortable and safe for you. The interstate can have varying speeds, so adjust accordingly. Ride at a speed that suits the current road and traffic conditions. Be cautious in adverse weather conditions or heavy traffic and adjust your speed to maintain control.

9. Be Prepared for Weather: Check the forecast before your ride and prepare for any conditions you might encounter, like rain, thunderstorms or strong winds. Before the start of any ride, consider yourself as a good pilot who checks the route in advance, knowing the weather in advance so you are the most prepared.

10. Use Defensive Riding Techniques: Always assume other drivers may not see you. Maintain a safe distance from vehicles, especially large trucks, and be prepared for sudden lane changes by other drivers.

Enjoy the ride and stay safe out there!
