Riding in the Cold: It's Coming, Get Ready

(Such as it is in the Sunshine State)

Believe it or not, I had a tough time finding reliable sources on cold weather riding in Florida, so I took what I could find and tailored it to our environment here.

No surprise, most of the items focused on riding well north of Florida and began with a focus on the effects of snow and ice on the bike. I must keep this to one page, so we'll focus on the rider.

- 1. **The cold makes you tired.** Your body must work harder to generate heat and burns more calories. The cold dehydrates the body as well. As the sun in the summer (and we have it in winter too, of course), the colder, dryer air takes the moisture out of you with less notice. That is, you won't have a sweaty shirt to remind you.
- 2. **The cold reduces dexterity.** Although the answer to the MSF question is you "ride a motorcycle with your eyes and your mind," you still need your hands and feet. A tip: Two things call for a mandatory stop: a shiver (core is getting cold) and stiff hands.
- 3. The cold reduces mental concentration. People can't help but think about being cold when feeling wind chill of 30 40 degrees. Stay focused on riding. The cold affects your reaction & movement time, accuracy, memory, decision-making, focus, and ability to do complex tasks, like riding a motorcycle! This raises the next topic.
- 4. Good riding gear essential. As with tires and brakes, go with a quality jacket, boots, and gloves. You can't go wrong always covering your neck. Rick Vincent led a ride to Ocala last winter and Don was smart enough to wear chaps. I snapped this pix when he wasn't looking! Consider heated gloves, jackets, and seats. Full face helmets are warmer. Related:
- 5. **Layer your clothes.** One article recommended multiple layers. Wicking, two insulating layers, and a waterproof shell.

So, you've done all this, and you may still be cold. What next?

- 1. **Exercise.** Do some at rest stops, but not to the point of sweating. Just stretching will keep you limber and increase blood circulation.
- 2. **"Field Expedients."** As said in the military. You won't look fashionable, but if caught in the cold a bit unprepared newspaper or plastic bags under your clothes will keep you warmer. The next gas station will have these.
- 3. Have snacks. Digestion burns calories, which creates heat.
- 4. **Know when to stop and take a break.** In the famous words of Clint Eastwood, "you have to know your limitations."

Remember:

Be Brilliant at the Basics. Keep the Routine, Routine. Every Move Must Have a Purpose.



RIDING ON THE INTERSTATE – MOTORCYCLE SAFETY TIPS

Riding a motorcycle on the interstate can be an exhilarating experience, but it also comes with its own set of challenges. Here are some tips to keep in mind:

1. **Gear Up**: Always wear proper protective gear, including a helmet, gloves, jacket, pants, and boots, also have rain gear on board. Proper gear offers both protection and comfort to make a big difference on long rides. Invest in high-quality protective gear, including a DOT-approved helmet, gloves, jacket, pants, and boots. Full gear can significantly reduce your chances of an accident.

2. **Pre-Ride Inspection**: Make sure your motorcycle is in good condition. Conduct a thorough pre-ride inspection of your motorcycle. Check the tires for proper tread and air pressure, oil levels, brake functionality, your battery and lights to ensure everything is in proper working order for the safest ride ahead.

3. Stay Visible: Wear bright or reflective clothing. This is true both during the day and at night time. Consider using a high-visibility vest. Whether riding solo or in a group ride, the bright vest increases your safety.

4. Use Signals Early: Signal your intentions well in advance of any lane changes or turns. Motorcycles can be less visible to drivers, so clear signaling helps communicate your movements. Consider using your signal in combination with hand signals, as both get other drivers' attention and make you a safer rider.

5. Keep a Safe Distance: Maintain a safe following distance from vehicles ahead of you. This gives you more time to react if something unexpected happens. Maintaining a safe following distance ahead gives you enough time to react to sudden stops or emergencies. Keeping a safe distance always applies; and especially more so during inclement weather such as foggy, rainy or other difficult traffic conditions.

6. Stay Focused & Take Rest Breaks: Keep your attention on the road and be aware of your surroundings. Avoid distractions like mobile phones or adjusting your music while riding. Remember the importance of "rest stops" to re-fuel, re-hydrate, and re-charge. This helps prevent fatigue and keeps you alert during your ride.

7. Watch for Road Hazards & Constructions Zones: Interstate roads can have debris, potholes, and other hazards. Keep an eye out for these and try to avoid them when possible. With construction zones, there might not always be a shoulder, as sometimes construction barriers leave no shoulder at all, which can be especially problematic if you have fuel, mechanical or weather issues, making it difficult to pull over.

8. **Maintain Speed and Control**: Ride at a speed that is comfortable and safe for you. The interstate can have varying speeds, so adjust accordingly. Ride at a speed that suits the current road and traffic conditions. Be cautious in adverse weather conditions or heavy traffic and adjust your speed to maintain control.

9. **Be Prepared for Weather**: Check the forecast before your ride and prepare for any conditions you might encounter, like rain, thunderstorms or strong winds. Before the start of any ride, consider yourself as a good pilot who checks the route in advance, knowing the weather in advance so you are the most prepared.

10. Use Defensive Riding Techniques: Always assume other drivers may not see you. Maintain a safe distance from vehicles, especially large trucks, and be prepared for sudden lane changes by other drivers.

Enjoy the ride and stay safe out there!

TRAILING A MOTORYCLE – MOTORCYCLE SAFETY TIPS

Owning a motorcycle sometimes requires trailering – possibly related to a call from a friend who is broken down or for other reasons. Safely trailering a motorcycle requires careful preparation, proper equipment and attention to detail.

Here's a checklist to help you transport a motorcycle securely:

- 1. Choose The Right Trailer.
- 2. Secure The Trailer Hitch, Chains & Lights.
- 3. Check Tire Pressure of Vehicle & Trailer Tires.
- 4. Gather Essential Equipment Ratchet Straps, Wheel Ramp, etc.
- 5. Prepare The Motorcycle for Loading onto Trailer.
- 6. Loading The Motorcycle onto The Trailer Safely.
- 7. Consider having a helper for added safety.
- 8. Walk the bike up the ramp (or ride slowly if inexperienced).
- 9. Place the front wheel into the wheel chock.
- 10. Ensure the bike is upright and balance before securing.
- 11. Put the kickstand down.
- 12. Secure The Motorcycle with Ratchet Straps.
- 13. Check & Re-Check Your Straps during the trip at stops.
- 14. Drive Safely/Watch Your Speed.
- 15. Load & Unload on Flat Ground.
